If you come in from the north (**Denver, Colorado Springs** etc.) take time to stop at the remarkable **Great Sand Dunes National Park & Preserve**. It is easily reached from either Hwy 285 north of Alamosa or Hwy 160 east of Alamosa. They have a great Visitor's Center and the area is fascinating. <u>www.nps.gov/grsa</u>

Of course a night or two in **Santa Fe** is wonderful if you are coming in from the south. The history, architecture, art, cuisine and culture are fascinating and it is only a short drive from Albuquerque which is the airport many of our guests use. **Taos** is always an interesting stop as well, but remember that if you raft you will be going there from the ranch during the week. There is a great drive east of Taos through Angel Fire, Eagle's Nest, Cimarron and Red River as well if you want to explore further before or after RTR.

To the west lies **Durango** with **Mesa Verde** further west and the Durango/Silverton train ride which used to be part of the same line as our nearby Cumbres & Toltec line, historic mining towns and wonderful scenery.

For those of you wanting to venture even further afield, we are an 8-hour drive from the **Grand Canyon**. **The Visitor's Center** there is 928.238.7888 or visit www.nps.gov/grca The fabulous **Canyon de Chelly** is about 5 hours from the ranch and a bit of a detour on the way to the **Grand Canyon**, but worth it: https://www.nps.gov/cach/index.htm (928) 674-5500
